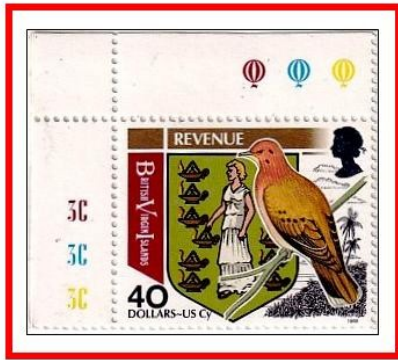


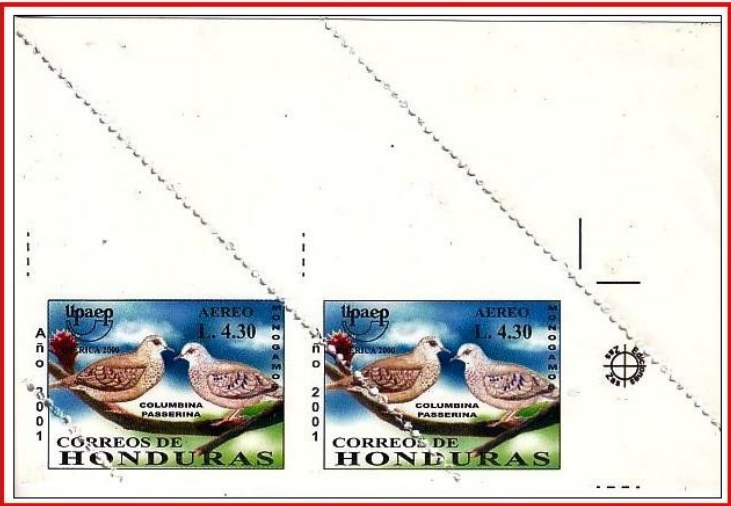
7. AN ICON & SYMBOL OF PEACE
