### 4.4 Keenest eyesight Geographical Distribution - Spread throughout Northern Hemisphere


Golden Eagle (Aquila chrysaetos) Ability - Seeing detail at great distance

Its retina has cone cells known as "foveae" which are special concentrations of receptors. All these modifications suggest that the term "eagle-eyed" remains a fair description of outstanding vision. It can sight a rabbit from a distance of about 3.2km. Their eyes are tubular, with ample pupil, and it can focus the image with speed and clarity

#### Meter Cancellation

Displayed below is a cut square of the window cover, commercially used in France, 1982, depicts the Bird. A postage meter or franking machine is a mechanical device used to create and apply physical evidence of postage to mailed matter. Postage meters are regulated by a country's postal authority. A postage meter imprints an amount of postage, functioning as a postage stamp, a cancellation and a dated postmark all in one.
