In 1910 South Africa was united into a single nation known as the Union of South Africa.

General elections were held on 26 May 1948, and they represented a turning point in the South African history, as the United Party and its leader, incumbent Prime Minister Jan Smuts, were ousted by the Herenigde Nasionale Party (HNP) led by D. F. Malan.
