


BREAST CANCER RESEARCH Semipostal Stamp

Featured in my thematic stamp collection, although not considered a joint-issue due to no cooperation between postal administrations, there is a strong link due to the borrowed design and purpose behind the stamp. All stamps shown are a part of my collection except for two which are marked as "missing" and the Cinderellas which were never issued.

Breast Cancer Research Semipostal Stamp - Preliminary Versions

Designed and executed by art director Ethel Kessler and by artist Whitney Sherman. Numerous pencil sketches and colour studies showing women in various poses were created, all of them intriguing; however, one design really stood out. It pictured a woman reaching above and behind her, as if preparing to conduct a breast self-examination. Sherman pictured Diana, goddess of the hunt -a strong, independent, survival minded figure - and the artwork developed into a depiction of the goddess reaching for an arrow. Kessler and Sherman finalized this heroic and hopeful image by removing a target from the figure's right breast and encircling the area with a concise phrase - "FUND THE FIGHT. FIND A CURE."





Breast Cancer Research Semipostal Stamp - United States of America

The Breast Cancer Research semipostal stamp was originally issued in 1998. It was first mandated by Congress in 1997 and later signed into law by President Bill Clinton. The 1998 Breast Cancer Research stamp was the first semipostal issued by the U.S. Postal Service. Semipostals are stamps sold at a surcharge to raise money for a particular cause. Purchase of this stamp supports the Breast Cancer Research work of the National Institutes of Health and the Medical Research Program of the Department of Defense. By law, 70 percent of the net amount raised is transferred to the National Institutes of Health and 30 percent is transferred to the Medical Research Program at the Department of Defense. To date more than 1,12 billion Breast Cancer Research stamps have been sold. The Breast Cancer Research Semipostal was issued in 1998 at a value of 40 cents (32 cents and 8 cents surcharge), and reissued in 2014 at a value of 60 cents (49 cents and 11 cents surcharge) with mandate until 2027.

The Breast Cancer Research semipostal stamp was such a success as a fund raiser for such a good cause that the design was later requested from the USPS by multiple other postal administrations for the issuance to raise funds for Breast Cancer Research. It can't be considered as a joint-issue as there is no cooperation between postal administrations and no same day issue, but it is considered a borrowed design series issued by multiple administrations with the same purpose. Up to date the following countries have also issued similar stamps: Hungary, Belize, Kenya, Gambia, Grenada, Micronesia, Kosovo, Macedonia, Jordan, Austria and Slovakia. Several other countries planned to release a similar issue but never got to officially do so, of these the design is known but no official stamps were released, they are considered as Cinderellas: Sweden, St. Vincent, Philipines, France, Greece, Israel and Brazil. I have added a design of my own for a Portuguese edition with a twist.


