THE ½ CENT KINGFISHER STAMPS

The ½ cent Kingfisher Stamp (the African Pygmy Kingfisher - *Ispidina picta*) was issued on 31 May 1961 together with stamps of the value of 1 c, 1½ c, 2 c, 2 ½ c, 3 c, 5 c, 7½ c, 10 c, 12½ c, 20 c, 50 c and 1 Rand.

The ½ c, 1½ c, 2½ c, 5 c and 20 c stamps have the Coat of Arms watermark sideways and the ½ c and 1½ c values have a perf of approximately 15 x 14.

In 1963/64, the 1961 set of stamps were issued again, this time on chalky paper, but with designs redrawn and a new 15 c value. The ½ c and 2 ½ c values have the R.S.A watermark sideways with the perf at approximately 15 x 14.

In the period 1967 to 1971, some of the designs were redrawn and printed on Swiss or Harrison paper with the R.S.A watermark tête-bêche. The stamps have fluorescence on the front.

In 1968, the ½ c and 1 c stamps were redesigned with the with the R.S.A watermark tête-bêche sideways on the ½ c value. The perf is 14 x 13½.

In 1969 to 1972, new values were added and phosphor bands of 3 or 5 mm were printed onto the stamps. The R.S.A watermark tête-bêche sideways on the ½ c value.

ISSUE 1 - MAY 1961

The stamps in this small format group exhibit fine cross-line screening, are perforated



15x14 gauge and conform to a sheet format of 200 units.



Three cylinders were used for this tri-coloured printing on Arms wmk. paper, the cylinder numbers being positioned on the sheets left margin, the cylinder number '34' being superimposed on number '9'.



The first distribution was without sheet serial numbers, while subsequent ones bore five figure black numerals in different positions on the sheets bottom margin.

The sheet's left and right margins are perforated through and carry carmine-red single line broken bars.



The sheet's top and bottom margin's have centrally imprinted on them

Brown horizontal mark on bar,

The sheets have blue single line broken bars along the left and right hand margins. Printing was done on the Goebels 340 machine.

Watermarked paper: C of A, facing right. Perforation 14:14. Type II. - heavy branches. Unsurfaced paper.

The left and right margins carry blue single broken bars - the right margin showing the blue "Ghost" background.



Only the marginal punched out hole on the bottom margin of pane A has concentric rings around it, and they are blue instead of brown.



Bottom arrow with inclined whitish line across left prong. Printers register mark with red continuous line, while brown and blue ones are broken. Neither pane has sheet numbers.



Sheet numbers appeared again later on approximately 2000 sheets, out of a total of 72000 sheets printed.



A second distribution of this issue appeared on Swiss coated RSA watermarked paper, in têche-bêche formation facing left and right. No alteration in printing data. Perforation 14 x 15.



Redrawn design. Surfaced paper. Fluorescent front only.

ISSUE 7A
SEPTEMBER 1968

The third distribution showed a marked change in printing data, which was an emergency printing. Same cylinders, same Swiss paper but a new cyclometer was used.



The new numbers have a new type of digit, thinner and clearer. Perforation 14x14. The left margin of Pane A is much wider and is imperforate.






