6.1) AIR RACING - CHALLENGE INTERNATIONAL DE TOURISME



Air racing began in 1909 when the first international meet was held at Reims, France. In the years before WWI, popular interest in aviation led to a large number of air races in Europe.

International Tourist Plane Contest (Challenge International de Tourisme). The four Challenges, from 1929 - 1934, were major aviation events in pre-war Europe.

Challenge 1932 & 1934 was won by Poland . The 1934 Challenge remained the last Challenge and the Polish Aero Club was given a right to retain a transitory cup.

6.2) AIR RACING - SCHNEIDER TROPHY
