

Maxim card depicting oldest mechanical musical instrument. A carillon consists of 23 cast bronze cup shaped bells, which played serially, sounded together by play chord.





Maracas also called Rumba shakers, Shac-Shacs, and various other names, are rattles which appear in many genres of Caribbean and Latin music.



Chocalho is the generic name for "shaker". There are various types of idiophones using this name in Portuguese language.



Raspador is open-end, hollow gourd with notches rubbing a stick or tin es along the notches to produce a ratchet sound.



Sonaja is the term used to denote a wide range of musical rattles.

Dorje is a double headed rattle, known to the Buddist monks from time immemorial and are used with a bell for meditation and religious chanting.



The Gogodala Rattle is another gourd rattle used as a dress accessory and is used as part of traditional dance dress.



The Hosho are traditional rattles consisting of a pair of maranka (mapudzi) gourds with seeds, and is basically a accompaniment instrument.



Claves is a percussion instrument, a pair of cylindrical hardwood sticks one of which is held in the player's fingertips over the cupped hand (a resonator). When struck together they produce a sharp ringing sound.









**Bak** is a wooden clapper used in Korean court and ritual music. The person playing the bak is called jipbak, serving as the conductor or musical s upervisor for the group.



The **jingle** an instrument consisting of a wooden handle and a metal bow fitted with loosely held jingles, is also mentioned in the Talmud and refers apparently to the Roman sistrum.



The modern pan is a chromatically pitched percussion instrument made from 55 gallon industrial drums.




















