






15 Brown Pelican & Magnolia








16 Willow Ptarmigan & Forget-me-not



It has brown upper parts with a white under part with dark streaks. The brown thrasher is an omnivore, with its diet ranging from insects to fruits and nuts.







20 Mountain bluebird & Sagebrush










21 Purple Finch & Lilac








22 Rhode Island Red & Violet:








23 Carolina Wren & Jessamine


25 California Gull & Sego Lily



This is the state bird of Utah. They are migratory, most moving to the Pacific coast in winter.

The **common pheasant** (Phasianus colchicus) is a bird in the pheasant family (Phasianidae). The genus name comes from Latin phasianus, "pheasant". he ring-necked pheasant is the <u>state bird</u> of <u>South Dakota</u>, one of only three U.S. state birds that is not a species native to the United States.
