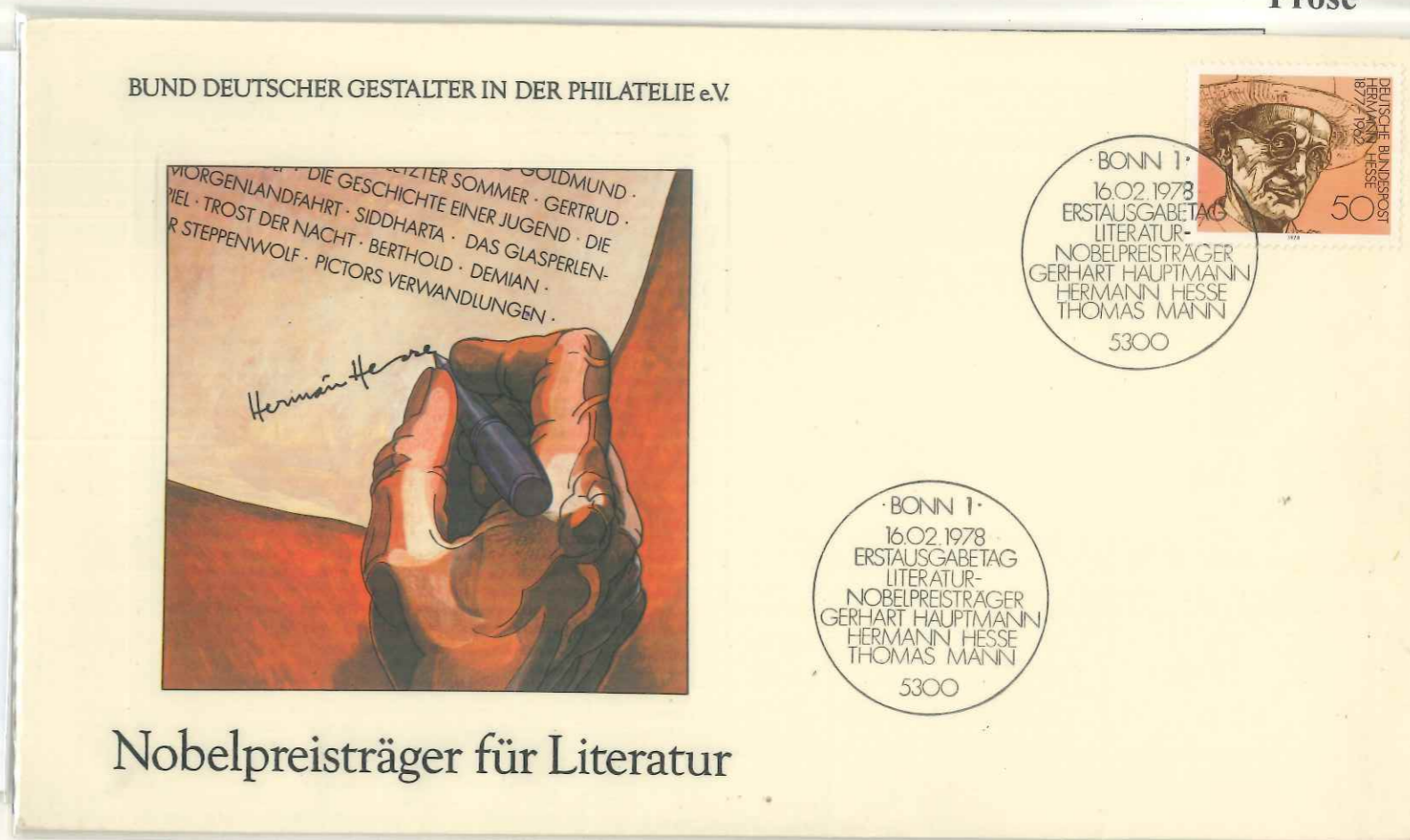




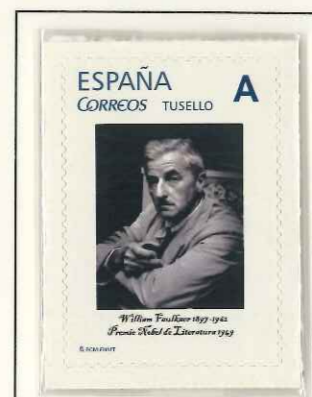

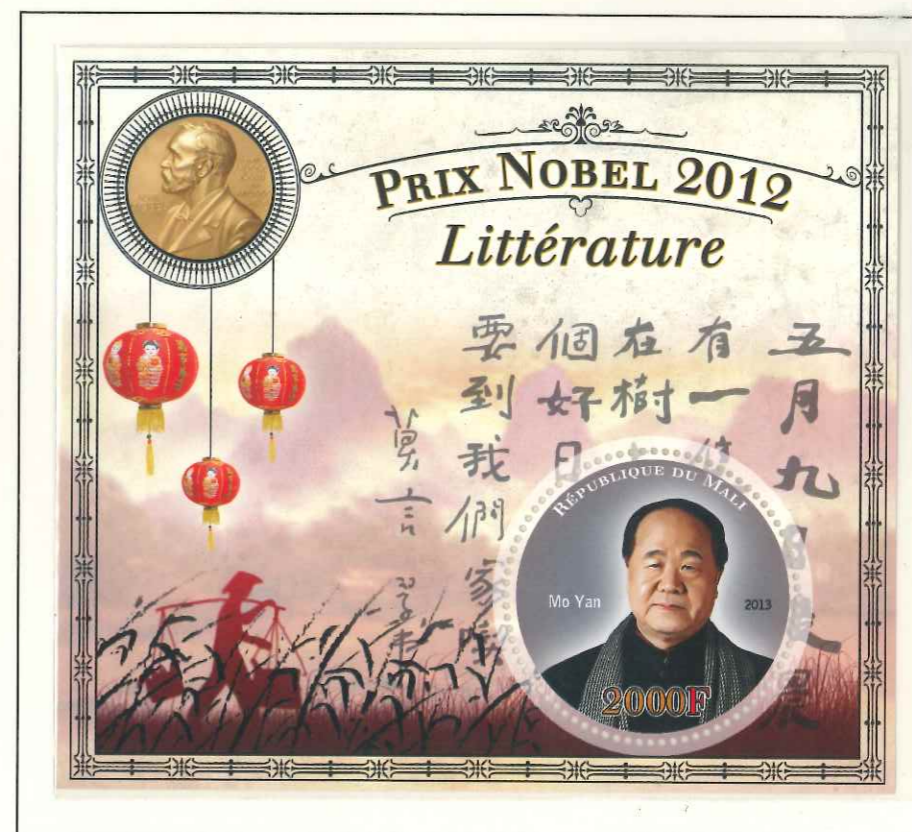
**Albert Camus**(1957): "for his important literary production, which with clear-sighted earnestness illuminates the problems of the human conscience in our times."
