works are translated all over the world. (The life Divine, Savitri etc)(15.8.1964).



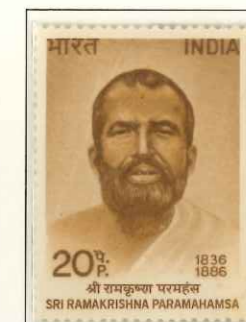
**SWAMI RAMA TIRTHA**  
(22.10.1873-27.10.1906)  
A poet, writer, spiritual leader whose works were compiled into 8 volumes (In woods of God realization) (11.11.1966).



**SWAMI SHRADDHANAND**  
(2.2.1856-23.12.1926)  
Propagated the teachings of Swami Dayanand & wrote on religious issues (30.3.1970).



**SWAMI VIRJANAND** (10.6.1873-30.5.1951)  
Wrote 'Shabda both' - & edited and published a biography of Vivekananda (14.9.1971).



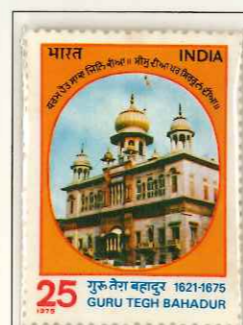
**SRI RAMAKRISHNA PARAMAHAMSA** (1836-1886)  
Preaching is reflected in Sri Sri Rama Krishna Kathamrita (18.2.1973).



**GURU GOBIND SINGH**  
(22.12.1666-7.10.1708)  
Through his poetic compositions, like Jaap Sahib presented divinity - on stamp Gurudwara shrine, Patna(17.1.1967).



**GURU NANAK DEV** (15.4.1469-22.10.1539)  
His teachings appeared in the Adi Granth (Japji) (23.11.1969).



**GURU TEGH BAHADUR**  
(1621-1675)A poet, warrior & 9<sup>th</sup> of ten Gurus of the Sikh religion wrote 16 shebads, 15 ragas and his works are included in Adigranth from pages 219 to 1427 (16.12.1975).



**SENPATI BAPAT** (12.11.1880-28.11.1967)  
Wrote commentaries on Bhagavad Gita & translated Aurobindo's works (28.11.1977).



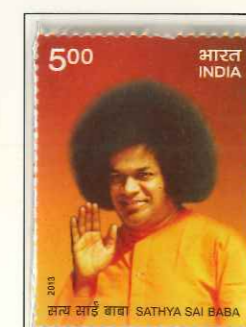
**SAINT ALPHANSA**  
(19.8.1910-28.7.1946)  
wrote 'As my good Lord Jesus loves me so very much, I sincerely desire to remain on this sick bed and suffer not only this, but anything else...'



**VIVEKANANDA**  
(12.1.1863-4.7.1902)  
Wrote Raja Yoga, Marma Yoga, Bhakti Yoga. He was a singer & poet (17.1.1963 & on 11.9.1993 & on 12.1.2013).



**RAMANA MAHARSHI** (30.12.1879-14.4.1950)  
Wrote Nan Yar? & other spiritual themes (14.4.1971 & on 14.4.1998).



**SATHYA SAI BABA**  
(1926-2011)Indian Guru, a spiritual leader, wrote Vahinis (28.11.2013).



**ACHARYA VIMAL SAGAR**(1916-1994)A Jain Acharya authored many books like Siddchakara Vidhan (14.12.2016).
