BUTTERFLIES

Butterflies are among the most attractive creatures in the animal world. They belong to an order of animals called 'Lepidoptera', derived from Greek words for scale and wing. Generally, butterflies are diurnal (creatures of the day), whereas moths are mostly nocturnal. A butterfly's life is broken into four distinct stages of development: the *ovum*, or egg; the *lava*, or caterpillar; the *pupa*, or chrysalis; and the *imago*, or winged adult. The issue features butterflies found in the Australian region.
